**TIP update:** Arrowood proved an update on TIP activities. There has been an increase in the number of persons making contact with TIP regarding invasives species. DNR and UWEX have named a representative to TIP. Arrowood explained the purpose of, membership of and funding sources of TIP. He is active in outreach and grant writing. Arrowood provided a brief history on the Langlade County Invasive Species Technician. 2013 & 2014 was spent inventorying the road right of ways. 2015 inventory continued with new population being recorded and 113 acres of invasive plants were treated. 2016 will continue with the treatment of invasive species. Arrowood distributed a treatment schedule for the year.

**Department Update:** Graupner read the written report provided by NRCS. She reported that the Evergreen Wolf River AEA application has been submitted. Department bills were looked at. McKay reported on the Lake Protection plant sale. This was a first time sales event with 16 participants purchasing approximately 250 plants. The Lake Protection grant paid for 50% of the cost and there was a requirement that the plants be planted within 35 feet of the shoreline.

**Upcoming events:** Solin gave a report on the April 28 Lumberjack RC&D meeting held in Vilas County. The next RC&D meeting will be held July 28 in Florence County. May 5 there is a DATCP meeting on the annual work plan, May 12 there is culvert training in Antigo. May 18 is the Spring Lake Day in White Lake and May 25 NCLWCA is scheduled in Wood County.
