**Approval of Minutes of the January 04, 2012 meeting**

**Child Support Report and paid bills**

Becky was absent, Robin Stowe presented the Child Support report and paid bills on Becky's behalf. The Child Support report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes. **Emergency Management Report and paid bills**

Brad Henricks was absent, Sheriff Greening presented the Emergency Management report and paid bills on Brad's behalf. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes. Moved by Cahak, second by Bonacci to approve the Emergency Management Report and paid bills. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

**Car Report**

Sheriff Greening presented the car report. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes. All vehicles are in good operating condition. Two new squads were delivered, still waiting on the Pickup. Moved by Olsen, second by Cahak to approve the Car Report. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

### **Sheriff/Jail Office/Medical Reports and paid bills**

Sheriff Greening presented the Jail Office report, no Medical report was submitted due to the Jail Nurse being gone for the week. Sheriff Greening informed the committee that all the state inmates are gone. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes. The Sheriff and Jail paid bills were submitted. Moved by Bonacci, second by Nonnenmacher to approve the Sheriff/Jail Office Report and paid bills. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

### **Discuss purchasing audio recorder for the jail booking area**

Sheriff Greening asked for committee approval to upgrade the camera recording system in the booking area to include audio. This is a protection for the county, right now it only has video. Sheriff Greening received a quote in September for \$3,635 to install the audio and asked that this be taken out of Jail Assessment because it is a permanent mounted system. Moved by Olsen, second by Bonacci to approve the purchase of the audio recorder for the booking area with funds to be taken from Jail Assessment. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

### **Discuss two additional casual employees for the Sheriff's Office**

Sheriff Greening asked for committee approval to hire two additional casual employees, one dispatcher and one deputy position. Sheriff Greening stated that the Sheriff's Office has always been short at least one dispatch position. With the long tenured employees receiving more vacation time it is costing a lot of overtime hours to cover the dispatch area. Filling with a casual employee would create significant saving on overtime. On the deputy side Sheriff Greening stated that he does not have enough personnel to cover transports and court room security. This was already taken to Personnel and approved. Moved by Olsen, second by Bonacci to approve hiring two additional casual employees for the Sheriff's Office and forward to the Executive Committee and County Board for approval. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

## Emergency Management Report-Feb. 2012



First, let me apologize for not being able to attend this month's meeting. I had a commitment with the Langlade Hospital Board. Sheriff Greening has been briefed on my report and is available to answer questions. January was a busy month. Several continued grant applications were submitted, and I received notice of a \$47,000.00 award for WISCOM (the State's Radio System) to connect the Dispatch Center and Sheriff's Dept. radios. Here is a brief synopsis of the month's activities:

- Attend Regional EM Directors meeting in Wausau.
- Coordinate webinar on the Damage Assessment application that is being developed.
- Attend Interoperability Symposium and WISCOM Training/Grant Writing days. Submitted grant application for Sheriff's Dept. (See attached grant award document)
- Worked with the North Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (NCWRPC) on completing Langlade County's Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan (TICP). (See draft document.)
- Participated in Langlade Hospital's regional training exercise on a mock tornado ripping across north central Wisconsin and hospital's evacuation and transfer of patients, and dealing with mass casualties for the deaths.
- Worked with Department Heads on the development of the employee handbook.
- Completed and submitted the Hazmat Equipment Grant for Langlade County.

## Office of Justice Assistance announces \$1.5 million awarded to local public safety agencies for interoperable communications

The Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) announced \$1.5 million in awards to local public safety agencies today as part of an ongoing statewide strategy to improve interoperable communications among Wisconsin's public safety and emergency response agencies.

Nineteen awardees in twelve counties (see page 2) will use \$1.5 million of federal Homeland Security funding to purchase new radios or upgrade existing radios that will be used on the statewide interoperable communication system (WISCOM).

"These grants reflect Governor Walker's commitment to public safety, and needed improvements in interoperable communications that will be implemented with the launch of the statewide WISCOM system," said John Murray, OJA Executive Director.

These radio grants are the second installment of a \$4 million program to expand emergency responder access to the statewide WISCOM system. Earlier this month Governor Walker announced \$2.5 million in grants to thirty awardees in fourteen counties. This \$4 million dollar investment will help to bring thousands of new radios onto WISCOM, the statewide interoperable communication system.

WISCOM is expected to be ready for mission critical operations by later this spring. Demand for using the system has already been brisk; nearly 230 agencies have registered close to 4,600 radios on the system.

WISCOM dramatically increases communications capacity for public safety and emergency responders, and allows responders from any area of the state to assist another community without losing communication capabilities. The statewide system is designed to operate with existing radio systems, and is flexible and open enough to work with the many different local and regional systems currently operating in the state.

Providing reliable and responsive interoperable communications has been a central goal of the Governor's Wisconsin Homeland Security Council, and has been a part of Wisconsin's comprehensive strategic homeland security planning efforts.

*OJA is the State Administering Agency for a number of federal criminal justice and homeland security grants, and serves as a policy coordinating entity for state and federal programs.*
