Call meeting to order/Pledge of Allegiance

Chairperson Bonacci called a meeting of the Laclede County Public Safety Committee to order on the above date at 8:00 a.m., the Pledge of Allegiance immediately followed.

Moved by Pennington, second by Dahms to excuse Larry Poltrock. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

Approval of Minutes of the June 02, 2015 meeting

Coroner Report

Larry Shadick presented the Coroner Report. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes.

Child Support Report

Becky McPhail presented the Child Support report. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes.

Brad Henricks presented the Emergency Management Report. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes.

Discuss and take action on a Mass Notification System

Brad Henricks informed the committee that the city tabled the outdoor weather sirens until they make other decisions. Brad has been looking at options for the community for a mass notification system. With nixle360 we would have to pay a fee to build the

database and use this system to send out notifications. The city is interested in this and would work with the county to pay half the cost. The fee is figured by the maximum population of 20,000 and the cost would be \$5,000 per year. The city is willing to pay \$2,500 and the county cost would be \$2,500. This offers us an opportunity to take care of areas that we couldn't in the past. Public Health has the funding, and there will be no charge to the citizens for this service. This would be under a three (3) year contract.

Moved by Pennington, second by Dahms to move this along. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

Request for County Administrator to seek RFP's for contracting of mental health services

The same concerns were discussed as last month's meeting.

Toni Simonson from NCHCC stated that they are looking at 24/7 coverage for crisis workers and hoping to get this implemented in the next few weeks. There are costs and NCHCC is using innovation funds right now to start these programs. Toni stated that they are trying to bridge the gaps for criminal justice and mental health issues and the goal is within the next two months to get the on call 24/7 coverage. Dahms stated that something needs to be done now.

After a lengthy discussion it was decided to see what other options may be available.

Moved by Pennington, second by Dahms to authorize Robin Stowe to make inquiries on what other services and options that are available in case things don't work out with NCHCC. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

Car Report

Sheriff Greening presented the car report. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes.

Moved by Dahms, second by Pennington to approve the Car Report. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

Sheriff/Jail Office/Nurse Report

Sheriff Greening presented the Jail Office report and Nurse Report. The report was placed on file in the County Clerk's office with the minutes.

Sheriff Greening informed the committee that he is in the process of finalizing updating the Jail Administrator job description and will start advertising next week.

Moved by Dahms, second by Cahak to approve the Sheriff/Jail Office/Nurse Report. All ayes. **Motion Carried.**

Emergency Management Report - July 2015

June pushed the summer activities into full swing. Some communications issues were solved involving the new Pickerel Local Government Tower and the siren activation in White Lake and Gardner Dam Scout Camp. A viable alternative to the City of Antigo siren situation was discussed by the City and offers great capabilities for Langlade County. Here is just a brief synopsis of some of the month's activities:

- Assisted Aspirus Langlade Hospital with their hazard and vulnerability assessment and mitigation efforts for those items identified.
- Met with Motorola, Mod-U-Com and County representatives as quotes are considered and clarified for new dispatch positions.
- Finalized and implemented the new Pickerel Local Government Tower, siren activation procedures for White Lake, the Gardner Dam Scout Camp and the programming of the Dispatch Center.
- Chaired the 16 county NEWCOM quarterly meeting.
- Attended the Northeast WEM Regional meeting on putting together a State Cyber Security Response Team for cyber emergencies.
- Attended MABAS training on communications and card development with the County Fire Depts.
- Met with the City of Antigo Council Committee and discussed Mass Notification Systems and NOAA Weather Radio distribution for residents.
- Attended the federal FirstNet consultation session for Wisconsin in Madison.
- Facilitated a functional exercise for Oneida County on the activation of the Emergency Operations Center.

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
