**Town of Antigo  
Annual Town Meeting  
April 19, 2017**

The Annual Town Meeting was called to order on April 19, 2017 at 7:30 p.m. by Chairperson Rick Parilek. Seven town residents and two nonresidents were in attendance.

The clerk read the minutes of the prior year's meeting. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Cal Krueger and seconded by Ken Hardin. A show of hands vote was taken. There were seven in favor. No one opposed. Motion carried.

Rick introduced the current board members present along with the town assessor, Gene Matuszewski, Jr.

The Town's 2016 Annual Financial Report was reviewed. Mike Winski motioned to accept the financial report as presented. Cal Krueger seconded. A show of hands vote was taken. There were seven in favor. No one opposed. Motion carried.

Dan Hafner, Fire Chief, and Mike Winski, Assistant Fire Chief, gave the fire department report. In 2016, the department had 75 runs – including 1 search and rescue. They currently have 19 firefighters, 2 EMTs, 2 probationary members and 2 junior members. The department has been very lucky to have received numerous grants which have helped in keeping their equipment up to date. They are currently looking to update their air packs. The fire department has annual fundraisers of calendars and raffles. The department has free smoke detectors available for anyone who needs one.

Jon Petroskey, Fire Chief for the City of Antigo, gave the ambulance report. In 2016, the Town of Antigo had 64 calls, an increase of 26 calls from 2015. The department has a tactical emergency medical services team (TEMS) which is part of the City's Special Response Team (SRT). This is for hostile situations so paramedics can immediately help any injured party. The department now has critical care paramedics who can use ventilators on a patient if needed. The department has overseen trauma kits being placed in every classroom in Langlade County.

In new business, Rick stated that the town's comprehensive plan is being updated. East Eighth Avenue is being worked on this spring with grant money assistance. A grant of \$15,000 was received to assist with Cherry Road work this summer.

A motion was made by Cal Krueger to set next year's annual meeting on Wednesday, April 18, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. Ken Hardin seconded. A show of hands vote was taken. There were seven in favor. No one opposed. Motion carried.

Being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn by Mike Winski at 8 p.m. Cal Krueger seconded. A show of hands vote was taken. There were seven in favor. No one opposed. Motion carried.
