

April 18, 2017

The regular monthly board was called to order after the Annual Meeting by Chairman Casper Buettner. Also present were Supervisor Susan Hawley and Jim Tilkens, Linda Frank, treasurer and Mary Lee Heise, clerk. Alex Emerich and individuals representing local ATV Clubs were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given by all those present.

The agenda was approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried.

The minutes of the March meeting were approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried.

The treasurer's report was read by Treasurer Linda Frank. Discussion on CDs to be renewed and transfer of money to the equipment replacement fund. This will be discussed in May. The report was thereafter approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried.

No non-board member business.

Old Business – Manure Hauling Permit – updates were done and a copy was sent to Spring Breeze Dairy.

New Business: ATV Ordinance for Crossing Bridge. Members of the White Lake ATV Club and surrounding ATV clubs came before the board requesting that the board adopt an ordinance authorizing the operation of ATV/UTVs on the bridge in Langlade on highway 64 by the highway 64/55 intersection which crosses the Wolf River. This motion was made by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Roger Tarplay, motion carried. Discussion followed on the wording of the ordinance. Sample ordinances had been presented to the board for this purpose. The clerk will prepare the new ordinance in a rough draft form and forward to members of the clubs to see if changes are needed before formal adoption in May. An update was given on trails that are in the works for ATV/UTV use and what they have been doing to get verbal easements or alternatives. The project is being done in steps. The bridge ordinance from our township is necessary, but a county ordinance is also necessary before the Department of Transportation will consider it.

General Building and Plant – 2 new flags are needed for the cemetery. Supervisor Tilkens took a catalog and will take it to the next meeting of the Boulder Lake Snogors, who will purchase the flags for the Town.

Highway – The road weight limits will go off on April 24th. Road inspections will be completed before the May meeting. The Cooperative Road Agreement with the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest was discussed. Right of ways is to be cleared through this agreement. Also discussed was the blacktopping of the parts of Sawyer Lake Road which were dug up after the road had been newly blacktopped. We were told that the forest service would be blacktopping these portions, but nothing has been done yet. The board will get estimates from North East Asphalt and provide them to the Forest Service in the hopes that these areas will be done this year. The town received a No Fee permit from Seneca farms

from Gillett to cross some of the town's roads for planting and harvesting purposes. The roads are North White Lake Drive and Erdman Road. Approval will be given as it is for planting and harvesting purposes.

Fire Department and Rescue Squad reports were given at the Annual Meeting.

Recycling Center – summer hours begin on May 1st. Containers will be placed for large items.

Cemetery – Discussed at the annual meeting, a roller will be rented to take care of the ruts. Rick Walters has started his spring cleanup.

Correspondence – A print out for the audio conference concerning Manure Management was presented for the board's review. The information from the printout did not seem to offer any new information regarding manure hauling and town roads. A letter was received from the DNR regarding a meeting to be held on April 27th regarding a Recreation Opportunity Analysis. A listing of zoning permits for March has been received. A letter was received from the State Department of Health Services regarding Cigarette Licenses and informing the town that we could charge up to \$100 for a cigarette license. The Census Bureau is requesting information about the township which the clerk will provide online before April 27th. White Lake has adopted a comprehensive plan. The clerk will contact the Village to see if any of their plan impacts the Town of Wolf River. Paperwork had been received regarding Payment in Lieu of Taxes money that was received and disbursements that will be made to the County, Tech School and White Lake School District from this money. The Salt Shed was inspected and it did pass inspection. The Town received a dividend from Rural Insurance based upon a recent insurance audit. The amount of the dividend was \$1,151.00 and was applied to our worker's compensation insurance. Packer City Trucks - after discussing repair work done and the amount of warranty to be applied to the last repair, the town received a credit of \$1,148.75, that was applied to the last bill received. A notice was received from Langlade County Land Records and Regulations concerning a minor subdivision proposed by the owners David and Peggy Kieper. The land is off of Hannah's Lane by Rose Lake.

Mr. Elmer Mulhullen requested that the board contact the state concerning a speed limit sign needed on highway 64 coming into Langlade from the east and west. Mr. Mulhullen called the state on this and was told that the request must come from the Town.

Bills submitted for payment were approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried.

Motion to adjourn was made by Supervisor Tilkens and seconded by Supervisor Hawley, motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:35 P.M.
