

November 13, 2014

Regular monthly town board meeting, at published in the Antigo Daily Journal and posted at the town hall and at Mike's Service was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Chairman Casper Buettner. Also present at the meeting were Supervisors Jim Tilkens and Susan Hawley, Linda Frank treasurer and Mary Lee Heise, clerk. Townspeople present were

The Pledge of Allegiance was given by all those present.

The agenda was approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens , motion carried.

Approval of the minutes for October was made upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried.

The treasurer's report was given by Linda Frank. Discussion followed on reimbursement from the county for ½ of cost of Hollister Road Bridge and their bill for bridge inspection. Thereafter the report was approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried. The Langlade County Highway Department will only be paid \$57.66 until further explanation is received for the balance of the bill. The Highway Department will be invited to the December 11, 2014 meeting.

Recognition of non-board members and non-board member business

Unfinished Business: Review of letter from 2012 from Langlade County concerning bridge inspections.

New Business: Removal of Beaver Dam on 9 Mile Creek – due to possible damage of the diversion of the water caused by the beaver house next to the Hollister Road Bridge, the town feels we should remove that beaver. This matter is tabled until spring.

Scenic Byway – The County wants the town to contribute to the cost of the project. This matter is tabled until a later date.

Set Budget Hearing Date – (The agenda said Board of Review by mistake) November 20, 2014 at 3:00 p.m.

General Building and Plant – nothing new to report.

Highway – Snowplowing has begun. Equipment is ready to go. Salt/sand deliveries have been made. The season has started early and we hope it goes smoothly as well.

Fire Department – Open house is in December 6th.

Rescue Squad – No meeting this month.

Recycling/Disposal Center – winter shoveling around containers was discussed.

Cemetery – They are all too cold to complain.

Correspondence was reviewed with the board by Clerk Heise: Notice of Spring Election notice has been prepared by the clerk. This notice is for the purpose of informing the public that at the spring election on April 7, 2015, the current town board is up for reelection. This notice has been submitted to the Antigo Daily Journal for publication. A reminder notice has been received from the Department of Transportation that the WISLR Road Certification is due by December 15, 2014. A notice from the Dept. of Revenue has been received informing the town that it has to pay a municipal fee of 16 cents for Assessment of Manufacturing Property. Letter was received pertaining to the meeting held on November 6th concerning Highway 55 from Highway 64 south. The letter lists the improvements to be made, however, construction is not scheduled until 2019; but could occur as early as summer 2016. The department of administration in Madison has sent the newest population estimate for the town, which is 745. A letter was received from REI Civil & Environmental Engineering thanking us for choosing them for the work on the bridge on East Hollister Road. A letter regarding the roads in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest was discussed. The letter concerns those roads in our township and how we feel they can be improved.

The bills for November were approved upon motion by Supervisor Hawley and seconded by Supervisor Tilkens, motion carried.
